2. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

Upon a motion duly made and seconded, it was VOTED unanimously to approve the minutes of the March 24, 2015, meeting.

3. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

a. New Employee Introductions

Craig Smith, Vice President for Institutional Advancement, introduced Jennifer Larkin, who was hired as his new assistant.

b. Community Education & Workforce Development Updates

Mulholland spoke about the Berkshire Robotics Challenge, explaining that 16 years ago Doug Crane had the idea to have a Lego competition and that competition has since grown into the Robotics Challenge we have today, with both middle and high schools participating.
