When the Berkshire County 40 Under Forty awards were created in 2016, we had a simple goal: to honor the ways young people improve the quality of life here in the Berkshires. From these humble beginnings grew a truly noteworthy annual event, as evidenced by the fact that we received more than 300 nominations this year. Our seven judges had a monumental task of awarding fewer than 14% of the nominees from a pool of diverse and impressive candidates. It was not an easy task, but the result is a selection of 40 young people who are making their communities a better place. We couldn't ask for better role models.

In addition to honoring these special young leaders, 40 Under Forty is also an important fundraiser for Berkshire Community College. This year, the proceeds benefit the College's Workforce and Community Education programs, which not only empower students with the tools and knowledge they need to succeed in the Berkshire County job market, but also help local employers fill urgent hiring needs. Thanks to the support of these programs, our students are hired as CDL drivers, EMTs, paraprofessional educators, community health workers and certified nursing assistants, to name a few.

Making this event even more special, Mill Town Foundation has yet again provided an incredible gift: Each of the 40 winners will be provided \$1,000 to give to an eligible Berkshire-based nonprofit organization of their choice. The far-reaching effects of this act of generosity are extraordinary. Our local non-profits will receive a total of \$40,000 to help further their missions, while our award winners will be instilled with a respect for philanthropy and the personal empowerment it brings. This empowerment, in turn, can pave the way for a lifetime of philanthropic purpose for future generations of community leaders.

Oftentimes, the people who do the most for our communities are the quiet leaders - the ones who give so much of their time but ask for no recognition. It is my hope that 40 Under Forty can shine the spotlight on these young people, even just for a moment, to honor them for all they do to make our community a better place in which to live and work. It is my privilege to present the awards to these special young people, who come from all walks of life but have one common goal: to do good in this little corner of the world we hold so dear. Congratulations to all nominees and award recipients, and warm thanks to our sponsors, partners, judges and supporters of this meaningful celebration.


Director of Finance, Austen Riggs Center





#### Program Director, College Internship Program



### Jen H. Weber




