Position Overview: The Learning Specialist is responsible for reading and interpreting psycho-educational evaluations and other professional documentation; determining appropriate accommodations, auxiliary aids, and services; providing reading and transcription services; training students in the use of assistive technology and adaptive computing; teaching students effective learning strategies; compiling statistics; developing and following policies and procedures; and other related duties as assigned.

Qualifications: Master's degree in special education, rehabilitation, counseling, or related field; five years of experience that includes college level assessment and ADA/504 compliance; or equivalent combination of education, training, and experience. Must have excellent written and verbal communication skills. Must have excellent interpersonal skills, be proactive, and enjoy working with students, faculty and staff. Must be organized, accurate, and flexible and have a demonstrated ability to work in a team environment. Must have good computer skills with ability to troubleshoot and assist students with adaptive computing hardware and software.
