

Keep America Connected Internet Resources

In response to the COVID-19 outbreak, the FCC has asked internet service providers (ISPs) to agree to the [Keep Americans Connected Pledge](#), an agreement to assist people who may have difficulty maintaining or affording internet access during this time.

Comcast (Xfinity)	Comcast has agreed to offer free WiFi for 2 months to low income families. They will also make all Xfinity hot-spots free to the public during this time.
Charter Communications (free internet)	Charter Communications is offering free internet access for 2 months.
AT&T	Offering open hot-spots, unlimited data to existing customers, and \$10/month plans to low income families.
Verizon	Verizon is making no special offers, but has agreed to follow the FCC agreement .
Sprint	Following the FCC agreement, Sprint is providing unlimited data to existing customers, and starting Tuesday, 3/17/2020, will allow all handsets to enable hot-spots for 60 days at no extra charge.
T-Mobile	Following FCC agreement, plus unlimited data to existing customers, and soon will also allow all handsets to enable hot-spots for 60 days at no extra charge.
